

ANDREWS, Barbara, a recent resident at Academy Village in Tucson, Arizona, passed away on Monday, October 8, 2007 at Tucson Medical Center. Born on July 6, 1937, in New York City, she dedicated much of her professional life to public service and helping others, first working as a social worker with the State of New Jersey Division of Youth and Family Services, and ultimately in the Office of the Commissioner of the State of New Jersey, Department of Health and Senior Services, from where she retired in 2006. She was also a licensed clinical social worker with psychotherapy practices in Princeton, NJ and New York City.
